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RESOLUTION NO. 2021-018

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DANIA BEACH, FLORIDA, AFFIRMING PARTICIPATION IN THE PROJECT PERTAINING TO NW 1 STREET FROM BRYAN ROAD TO US-1/SR 5; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; FURTHER, PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization ("MPO") approved the "Complete Streets and other Localized Initiatives Program" ("CSLIP") on July 9, 2015; and

WHEREAS, NW 1 Street from Bryan Road to US-1/SR 5 was evaluated and ranked by the MPO, then vetted to determine programmability in accordance with the CSLIP policies; and

WHEREAS, a resolution from the City of Dania Beach Commission stating support for the project is required to establish funding eligibility; and

WHEREAS, the project is included in the Broward County MPO current adopted fiscal year 2021-2025 Transportation Improvement Program ("TIP") using federal funds; and

WHEREAS, federally funded projects off the state highway system are delivered using the federally mandated Local Agency Program ("LAP") process; and

WHEREAS, the City of Dania Beach commits to administer and deliver the project under LAP; and

WHEREAS, the LAP is reimbursement based as specified in the LAP agreement; and WHEREAS, the City of Dania Beach commits to program funding for construction contingency per the requirements of LAP; and

WHEREAS, NW 1 Street from Bryan Road to US-1/SR 5 will be constructed within the Agency's right of way; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the City to maintain or coordinate the maintenance of the roadways after the project's completion;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DANIA BEACH, FLORIDA:

- Section 1. That the above "Whereas" clauses are ratified and confirmed, and they are made a part of and incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.
- Section 2. That the City Commission authorizes staff to incorporate the NW 1 Street from Bryan Road to US-1/SR-5 Project in the City's Capital Improvement Plan to coincide with

the MPO's Transportation Improvement Plan and to provide up-front funding that will be reimbursed by the Florida Department of Transportation ("FDOT").

Section 3. That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. That this Resolution shall become effective upon its passage and adoption. PASSED AND ADOPTED on February 9, 2021.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF DAVIE, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING THE ORANGE DRIVE PEDESTRIAN CONNECTIVITY PROJECT FROM SW 92 AVENUE TO SW 62 AVENUE BEING FUNDED AND DELIVERED UNDER THE LOCAL AGENCY PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Broward County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) approved the Complete Streets and other Localized Initiative Program (CSLIP) on July 9th, 2015;

WHEREAS, the Orange Drive Pedestrian Connectivity Project (Project No. 443950.1) from SW 92nd Avenue to SW 62nd Avenue was evaluated and ranked by the MPO, then vetted to determine programmability in accordance with CSLIP policies;

WHEREAS, a resolution from the Town of Davie Town Council stating support for the project is required to establish funding eligibility;

WHEREAS, the project is programmed in Broward MPO's currently adopted fiscal year 20121-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) using federal funds;

WHEREAS, federally funded projects off the state highway system are delivered using the federally mandated Local Agency Program (LAP) process;

WHEREAS, the Town of Davie commits to administer and deliver the project under LAP;

WHEREAS, the LAP program is reimbursement based as specified in the LAP agreement;

WHEREAS, the Town of Davie commits to funding upfront costs for design, Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) services, and construction to be then reimbursed as per the LAP agreement;

WHEREAS, the Town of Davie commits to program funding for construction contingency per the requirements of LAP;

WHEREAS, the Orange Drive Pedestrian Connectivity Project from SW 92nd Avenue to SW 62nd Avenue will be constructed within the agency's right of way;

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Town of Davie to maintain or coordinate the maintenance of the roadways after the project's completion.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

RE: City Resolutions – Off-System / LAP Projects

We are writing in response to many resolutions the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) have received from Broward County municipalities regarding FDOT's direction over the past year to return to the standard method of delivering federally funded local projects. The resolutions are asking that the Department provide funding for design and construction engineering inspection (CEI) services for any off-system Local Agency Program (LAP) projects that are programmed in the FDOT Work Program.

We, Gerry O'Reilly (FDOT District Four Secretary) and Greg Stuart (Broward MPO Executive Director), have discussed this request and we are both agreeable that funding will be programmed for design and CEI services for new LAP projects and for LAP projects that were previously programmed to be FDOT administered.

We think it is important to provide some background and historical context to explain how we reached this point. Certain categories of federal funds can be spent on any roads, state or local. Typically, if the MPO identifies an eligible project off the State Highway System, then the local entity with jurisdiction over the roadway enters into an agreement with FDOT (a LAP agreement) that allows the local agency to be reimbursed with federal funds for the project. The LAP agreement is required by Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to ensure the local agency is qualified to administer federal funds and agrees to follow all relevant federal processes.

This is how all other FDOT districts approach LAP projects and how we here in Broward approached off-system projects until about thirteen years ago. At that time there were many LAP projects underway but few making progress towards construction. We (FDOT and the Broward MPO) discussed how we could improve the process and accelerate construction. We agreed that if the program only paid for construction and local municipalities were required to pay for design and inspection then a local municipality would be incentivized to only pursue projects they were committed to completing. This also allowed the MPO administered dollars to stretch further and produce even more construction projects.

A few years later, FDOT also agreed that we would assist with designing and delivering some off-system projects as resources allowed. Over the last nine years, FDOT has delivered many off-system projects primarily through the MPO's Mobility Program and Complete Streets Local Initiatives (CSLIP) Program. This approach resulted in the implementation of several off-system projects being designed and constructed by FDOT; many more projects than we expected almost a decade ago. However, FDOT has found the following:

- FDOT does not have the same level of staff availability and experience to manage the projects as we have had in the past;
- FDOT has many more State commitments to address on the State Highway System than we did nine years ago; and
- FDOT often finds itself in the middle of a local issue, on a local road, that is best resolved by the local entity without FDOT in the process.

FDOT and the MPO have discussed over the last several months the best way to transition from FDOT delivering local projects to local municipalities delivering their own projects. We are agreeable to using federal funds to support design and CEI for LAP projects. While this will result in fewer construction projects, it will not unnecessarily burden our municipalities as we transition to the traditional delivery method for off-system projects. FDOT will still retain the role of overseeing local agencies (through the FDOT LAP office) to ensure they follow federal requirements, meet project schedules, and fulfill project commitments so that they may be reimbursed with federal funds.

The changes needed in the FDOT Work Program to have design and CEI services on each local agency project will be completed in next year's Work Program (approximately 10 months from now). Our respective agencies are committed to continue working though this transition over the next 10 months as part of the next cycle of Work Program development. We hope this change alleviates your concerns as we all work to deliver much needed improvements on our transportation network.





Executive Summary:

The Broward County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) approved the Complete Streets and other Localized Initiative Program (CSLIP) on July 9th, 2015. The Town submitted application for the Orange Drive Pedestrian Connectivity Project (Project No. 443950.1) from SW 92nd Avenue to SW 62nd Avenue for programming, which was evaluated and ranked by the MPO, then vetted to determine programmability in accordance with CSLIP policies. This project will provide infill sidewalk connectivity on the north side of Orange Drive and connections from the north side of Orange Drive to the Linear Park trail. The project received favorable consideration and is programmed in Broward MPO's currently adopted fiscal year 2021-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) using federal funds.

Federally funded projects off the state highway system are delivered using the federally mandated Local Agency Program (LAP) process, and the Town of Davie must commits to funding upfront costs for design, Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) services, and construction to be then reimbursed as per the LAP agreement. The Town also commits to program funding for construction contingency per the requirement of LAP. A resolution from the Town of Davie Town Council stating support for the project being funded and delivered under the Local Agency Program is required to establish funding eligibility.

The LAP is a reimbursable program. Future CIP amendments will be performed to provide for the anticipated project costs. Design for the project is anticipated to be programmed in FY2024 with an estimated cost at \$322,939.00 funded by the Broward County MPO. Construction and CEI costs are anticipated to be programmed in FY2026 and are estimated at \$891,892.00 funded by FDOT and the Broward County MPO. A construction contingency is also required and is generally not reimbursable under the program, and an amount of \$90,000.00 will be earmarked from Town funds for the project through a future CIP amendment.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF WESTON, FLORIDA, AND AS THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE INDIAN TRACE DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, AND AS THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE BONAVENTURE DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT SUPPORTING THE ADMINISTRATION AND DELIVERY OF PROJECTS UTILIZING THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION LOCAL AGENCY PROGRAM FOR THE PROJECTS PREVIOUSLY APPROVED IN CYCLES TWO, THREE AND FOUR OF THE BROWARD METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION COMPLETE STREETS AND OTHER LOCALIZED INITIATIVE PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, First, the Indian Trace Development District and the Bonaventure Development District are dependent special districts of the City of Weston for the purpose of exercising all those rights, powers and authority contained in Chapters 189 and 190, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, Second, the City Commission of the City of Weston serves as the governing board of both the Indian Trace Development District and the Bonaventure Development District; and

WHEREAS, Third, under the authority provided in Title 23, Section 134 of the United States Code (23 USC 134), the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (the "MPO"), the metropolitan planning organization designated for the Broward County metropolitan planning area, approved the Complete Streets and other Localized Initiatives Program (CSLIP) on July 9, 2015, which uses federal funds to help advance segments and components of the region's transportation network; and

RE: City Resolutions – Off-System / LAP Projects

We are writing in response to many resolutions the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) have received from Broward County municipalities regarding FDOT's direction over the past year to return to the standard method of delivering federally funded local projects. The resolutions are asking that the Department provide funding for design and construction engineering inspection (CEI) services for any off-system Local Agency Program (LAP) projects that are programmed in the FDOT Work Program.

We, Gerry O'Reilly (FDOT District Four Secretary) and Greg Stuart (Broward MPO Executive Director), have discussed this request and we are both agreeable that funding will be programmed for design and CEI services for new LAP projects and for LAP projects that were previously programmed to be FDOT administered.

We think it is important to provide some background and historical context to explain how we reached this point. Certain categories of federal funds can be spent on any roads, state or local. Typically, if the MPO identifies an eligible project off the State Highway System, then the local entity with jurisdiction over the roadway enters into an agreement with FDOT (a LAP agreement) that allows the local agency to be reimbursed with federal funds for the project. The LAP agreement is required by Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to ensure the local agency is qualified to administer federal funds and agrees to follow all relevant federal processes.

This is how all other FDOT districts approach LAP projects and how we here in Broward approached off-system projects until about thirteen years ago. At that time there were many LAP projects underway but few making progress towards construction. We (FDOT and the Broward MPO) discussed how we could improve the process and accelerate construction. We agreed that if the program only paid for construction and local municipalities were required to pay for design and inspection then a local municipality would be incentivized to only pursue projects they were committed to completing. This also allowed the MPO administered dollars to stretch further and produce even more construction projects.

A few years later, FDOT also agreed that we would assist with designing and delivering some off-system projects as resources allowed. Over the last nine years, FDOT has delivered many off-system projects primarily through the MPO's Mobility Program and Complete Streets Local Initiatives (CSLIP) Program. This approach resulted in the implementation of several off-system projects being designed and constructed by FDOT; many more projects than we expected almost a decade ago. However, FDOT has found the following:

- FDOT does not have the same level of staff availability and experience to manage the projects as we have had in the past;
- FDOT has many more State commitments to address on the State Highway System than we did nine years ago; and
- FDOT often finds itself in the middle of a local issue, on a local road, that is best resolved by the local entity without FDOT in the process.

FDOT and the MPO have discussed over the last several months the best way to transition from FDOT delivering local projects to local municipalities delivering their own projects. We are agreeable to using federal funds to support design and CEI for LAP projects. While this will result in fewer construction projects, it will not unnecessarily burden our municipalities as we transition to the traditional delivery method for off-system projects. FDOT will still retain the role of overseeing local agencies (through the FDOT LAP office) to ensure they follow federal requirements, meet project schedules, and fulfill project commitments so that they may be reimbursed with federal funds.

The changes needed in the FDOT Work Program to have design and CEI services on each local agency project will be completed in next year's Work Program (approximately 10 months from now). Our respective agencies are committed to continue working though this transition over the next 10 months as part of the next cycle of Work Program development. We hope this change alleviates your concerns as we all work to deliver much needed improvements on our transportation network.



WHEREAS, federally funded projects off the state highway system are delivered using the federally mandated Local Agency Program (LAP) process; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sunrise commits to program funding for construction contingency per the requirements of LAP agreement; and

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DEERFIELD BEACH, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING THE SIDEWALK/OFF-ROAD SHARED USE PATH PROJECT TO CONNECT THE CITY'S TRAILHEAD LINEAR PARK TO QUIET WATERS PARK (THE "PROJECT"); AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF THE CYCLE 5 APPLICATION TO THE BROWARD METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR COMPLETE STREETS LOCALIZED INITIATIVE **PROGRAM FUNDING** FOR THE PROJECT: AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF GRANT A AGREEMENT: PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (the "MPO") Complete Streets and other Localized Initiatives Program ("CSLIP") provides funding for local transportation projects that improve the safety and mobility for all transportation users in Broward County; and

WHEREAS, the 2015 City of Deerfield Beach Complete Streets Implementation Plan identified corridors for improvement in accordance with the City's Complete Streets Guidelines, including Powerline Road; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation ("FDOT") is in the planning stages for a milling and resurfacing project that will improve the Powerline Road corridor from NW 30th Place to West Drive (the "FDOT Project"); and

WHEREAS, in discussions with FDOT regarding the FDOT Project, the City requested consideration for a wide sidewalk/off-road shared use path to connect the City's Trailhead Linear Park to Quiet Waters Park (the "City Project") to be included in the FDOT Project; and

WHEREAS, FDOT indicated this City Project would require a local commitment of funds; and

WHEREAS, due to constraints in revenue, the City cannot commit to the local funding option without further assistance and is seeking the CSLIP grant opportunity for such assistance to deliver the City Project; and

WHEREAS, the City Project will be evaluated and ranked by the MPO, then vetted to determine programmability in accordance with the CSLIP policies; and

WHEREAS, a resolution of the City Commission stating support for the City Project is required to establish funding eligibility; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission supports the City Project and endorses FDOT delivering the City Project on the City's behalf, fully administering the design and construction phases of the City Project; and

WHEREAS, the City Project will be constructed within the State's right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the City to maintain or coordinate the maintenance of the City Project after the completion of the City Project; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends the City Commission authorize the submission of the Application to the MPO for Cycle 5 of the CSLIP for the City Project (the "Application") and authorize execution of a Grant agreement, if awarded.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DEERFIELD BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FÓLLOWS:

Section 1. The above referenced "Whereas" clauses are true and correct and made a part hereof.

Section 2. The City Commission hereby supports the City Project and authorizes the submission of the Application to the MPO for Cycle 5 of the CSLIP for the City Project. The City Manager is authorized to sign and submit the Application.
