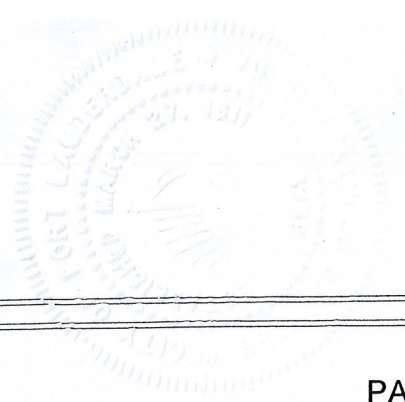

SECTION 2. The office of the City Attorney shall review and approve as to form all documents prior to their execution by City officials.



WHEREAS, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization ("Broward MPO") approved the draft Commitment 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan ("Commitment 2045 MTP") Cost Feasible Plan on May 9, 2019;

WHEREAS, the Broward County Transit ("BCT") Hollywood/Pines Boulevard Rapid Bus and University Drive Rapid Bus projects have been identified as transportation needs and are currently ranked second and third, respectively, in the approved draft Commitment 2045 MTP Cost Feasible Plan;

WHEREAS, the Broward MPO has requested a resolution from the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida (the "Board"), demonstrating support for inclusion of the projects in the final Commitment 2045 MTP; and

WHEREAS, the Board commits to working with the Broward MPO, transportation partners, and the public to prepare the projects for programming in the Broward MPO's Transportation Improvement Program, NOW, THEREFORE,

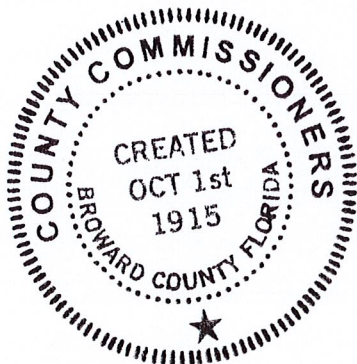

REQUESTED ACTION:

MOTION TO APPROVE: A Resolution of Support for inclusion of South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA) projects in the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). These projects include the South Florida Rail Corridor (SFRC) to Florida East Coast (FEC) Corridor rail connection in Pompano Beach, funds towards the purchase of locomotives and coaches to replace the aging Tri-Rail fleet, and funds for Tri-Rail mobile ticketing and fare verification equipment.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

The Broward MPO is currently developing its 2045 MTP. The MTP allocates available funding to maintain and improve Broward's transportation system now and in the future and serves as the basis for identifying priorities and transportation projects that will be implemented in the coming years, through 2045.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND (Continued):

Federal law requires the Broward MPO to update their MTP (previously called the Long Range Transportation Plan) every five (5) years. Work on the MTP, began in December 2017 and will be completed in 2019. The Broward MPO will then adopt the final plan. Depending on funding availability, projects included as part of the MTP can be completed in as little as six (6) years.

The following SFRTA projects are identified as transportation needs and are currently ranked in the approved draft 2045 MTP Cost Feasible Plan:

- \$77,700,000 in Fiscal Years (FY) 2026-2030 for a critical track connection between the SFRC and the FEC Corridor in Pompano Beach
- \$24,333,333 in FY 2031-2035 for a third of the cost to replace Tri-Rail rolling stock, specifically six (6) new locomotives and 10 new bi-level coaches
- \$2,625,000 in FY 2036-2045 towards the purchase of Tri-Rail mobile ticketing and fare verification equipment.

A resolution from the SFRTA confirming support for the above projects is required for the projects to be included in the final 2045 MTP.

SFRTA commits to working with the Broward MPO, transportation partners, and the public to prepare the projects for programming in the Broward MPO Transportation Improvement Program.

WHEREAS, the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (the "Authority") is a body politic and corporate, and an agency of the State of Florida established by Part II of Chapter 343, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is a transportation policy-making agency created under federal law to direct urban transportation planning and the allocation of federal and state transportation funds; and

WHEREAS, federal law requires the Broward MPO to update their Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) every five (5) years; and

WHEREAS, The MTP allocates available funding to maintain and improve Broward's transportation system now and in the future and serves as the basis for identifying priorities and transportation projects that will be implemented in the coming years and through 2045; and

WHEREAS, the Broward MPO approved the draft Commitment 2045 MTP Cost Feasible Plan on May 9, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the following project(s) are identified as transportation needs and are currently ranked in the approved draft 2045 MTP Cost Feasible Plan:

- \$77,700,000 in Fiscal Years (FY) 2026-2030 for a critical track connection between the SFRC and the Florida East Coast (FEC) Corridor in Pompano Beach
- \$24,333,333 in FY 2031-2035 for a third of the cost for new service expansion and/or replace Tri-Rail rolling stock, specifically six (6) new locomotives and 10 new bi-level coaches
- \$2,625,000 in FY 2036-2045 towards the purchase of Tri-Rail Mobile Ticketing and Fare Verification equipment; and

WHEREAS, a resolution from the Authority stating support for the project(s) is required for the projects to be included in the final 2045 MTP Cost Feasible Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Authority commits to working with the Broward MPO, transportation partners, and the public to prepare project(s) for programming in the Broward MPO's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Transit Priority 4-5 - SFRTA

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT DULY RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SOUTH FLORIDA REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY:

Section 1. The recitals contained in the preamble to this Resolution are incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Governing Board of the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority supports the inclusion of its projects into the Broward MPO's 2045 MTP Cost Feasible Plan.
