
### Let's Go Biking! 2017

The 4<sup>th</sup> Annual 2017 Let's Go Biking event was held on Sunday, March 19, 2017 in Pompano Community Park. It was a perfect day to host nearly 60 people and have so many active participants.



### Groundbreaking Events

Two groundbreaking events are in the beginning stages of planning for Hollywood Boulevard and Sunset Strip. Those dates are anticipated to be in June or July, however exact dates will be provided as soon as they are available. A ribbon cutting is also being planned for SW 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue.



## Complete Streets Master Plan

The main goal of the Broward MPO's Complete Streets Master Plan is to develop a prioritized list of Complete Streets projects to be programmed into Broward MPO's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). This will essentially identify the next round of mobility projects that may receive Complete Streets Initiative funding or perhaps be the subject of future grant applications such as has been seen in recent mobility projects.

The Project Advisory Committee (PAC) has been created and will meet periodically to guide the development of the Complete Streets Master Plan. The first PAC meeting is on Monday, May 22, 2017. Public involvement will begin this summer throughout the fall. The Master Plan is anticipated to be ready for a 2018 delivery.


### Equitable Healthography and Complete Streets

Presented by Anthony Olivieri,

MURP founder of FHEED (Food for Health, the Environment, Economy and Democracy) and TOUCH Partner

Healthography was introduced as the study of place and health or how place shapes health. Studies show that where you live and the environment that you grew up in can impact your overall health; in addition, where there are great social inequities, health inequities will follow.


One of the graphics shown depicted a scenario of resources being shared equally among two different communities, however, this generates further inequities in that not everyone is born into equal circumstances, therefore not everyone will utilize the same amount of resources. If more resources are provided to underserved communities in need they will have the opportunity to thrive.



There are many complex factors that have contributed to a person's state of health: policy or socioeconomic, cultural and political environment affect place, social and physical environment. The place you live effect's your lifestyle, therefore affecting your current health; in turn creating deeper health disparities among those in need.

Health disparities are the differences in health and rates of illness among different populations while health inequities describe the differences in the quality of health among different groups of people, primarily when the factors are avoidable and are considered unjust.

For example, in Broward County the diabetes disparity among the African American community and the Caucasian community is 159%. Diabetes in the African American community can largely be attributed to the lack of access to quality and nutritious foods, also known as food deserts.



In addition, many of these same communities that suffer from health disparities are also suffering from injury disparities. People living in communities with fewer resources were at a higher risk of being involved in pedestrian related crashes.

Conclusions:

- There are alarming number of preventable health inequities in Broward County, which appear to be associated with community-level poverty and disinvestment.
- Patterns of pedestrian injuries appear to be more frequent and severe in tracts with greater poverty.
- Currently, the number and length of Complete Streets projects appear to be implemented with equity in mind.
- However, are we building community capacity in higher poverty neighborhoods to fully benefit from Complete Streets Projects?

## High Visibility Enforcement Campaign: Targeting Jaywalkers

### Presented by Sgt. Brandi DeVecchio and Officer David Morales, City of Coconut Creek Police Department


The High Visibility Enforcement Campaign was created as a way of engaging and educating jaywalkers and in addition, motorists who were stopping in the middle of a crosswalk at a red light. Three phases were established: Education, Written Warning and Enforcement. Throughout the Education phase the officers participating handed out cards consisting of rules and statistics to bicyclists, motorists and pedestrians. Next officers focused on written warnings to remind community members of the laws. Last, the law was enforced, though a significant drop in citations were issued as opposed to warning tickets handed out.

**Action Item:** Jaywalking can be considered offensive, therefore “misguided crossing” has been presented as a more appropriate term.

**Action Item:** Remember when operating a vehicle to come to a complete stop before the crosswalk.

**Action Items:** *If cities are interested in participating in this campaign, it is encouraged to get the city's traffic units involved.*

**Action Items:** *More research is requested before placing barriers in medians.*
