


What is the LRTP?

- Long Range Transportation Plan
- Mandated by 23 CFR 450.322
- LRTP must be updated every 5 years and contain certain elements:
 - at least a 20-year planning horizon
 - include both long-range and short-range strategies/actions that lead to the development of an integrated multimodal transportation system
 - facilitate the safe and efficient movement of people and goods in addressing current and future transportation demand
- The 2040 LRTP must be adopted by December 2014




How likely would you be to start using or increase your use of public transit if the following improvements were made?



Not likely Somewhat likely Very likely




How likely would you be to start or increase cycling if the following improvements were made?



Not likely Somewhat likely Very likely




How likely would you be to start or increase walking if the following improvements were made?

- Maximizes project delivery




Complete Streets Programmatic Approach

Interstates and Turnpike, \$2,252,900,000

Major Capital Transit Projects, \$840,400,000

Major Capital Roadway Projects, \$842,400,000

Complete Streets and Other Localized Initiatives, \$571,600,000



■Bicycle ■Pedestrian ■Transit ■Roadway ■Freight

- Consolidates local projects into a program evaluated and funded by the Board
 - projects that qualify as categorical exclusions (CE) or 4(f) under the National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA)
- Projects start in FY2019/20
- Program details are being developed now
