Cyclovias

- FDOT is working around the state to provide MOT planning and support as well as general support like permit waivers
- FDOT is more willing to provide support for cities to get Cyclovias going, then hand off back to municipalities to continue on their own

Healthiest Weight Florida

- (Recognition program, awarded by the Surgeon General, where the healthiest cities are being awarded for programs like Cyclovia and other healthy activities)
- Greg Stuart, Executive Director of Broward MPO) wants cities to get together and nominate some of the work that's currently being done in Broward County under the umbrella of Complete Streets to the Healthiest Weight Competition (mentioned by Ellen Feiller)
- (Cyclovia is a closed-street event for pedestrians or bicycles and
 events or could be a partial-street closing, for the purposes of
 education, promoting safety and multiple methods of travel, to raise
 awareness of safety issues and for economic development purposes,
 such as a weekend event that may help promote and support a
 business corridor; can be linked to other community events like a

City of Pompano Beach Presentation

- Presentation by Victor Haye, Principal Planner from City of Pompano Beach
- City realized the effort had to be a team effort and adapted to City of Pompano Beach's uniqueness and communities
- Engineering, Utilities, Waste, combined efforts among City teams to consider how to integrate Complete Streets in Pompano Beach
- The CRA developed a series of projects, and through good design, are already accomplishing supportive measures
- Pompano Beach utilized the Broward County Complete Streets manual and created a presentation for Planning and Zoning Staff
- City Commission's goals and their physical goals with Complete Streets needed to be merged
- How to connect zones and within zones was a focus in their strategy
- How do they implement and regulate?
- How do they introduce to citizens?
- How do you fund and enforce the installation, once designed?
- City created a matrix to guide (what they expect to see from their understanding of their local environment; based on scale and their perceptions of reality)
- City considered how they viewed and integrated other master plans, such as the bicycle- and the pedestrian master plan
- · City identified, listed and prioritized amenities
- City wondered how they could make an impact quick enough
- City is continuing to look for suggestions from the MPO
- City identified and mapped what the city would look like with prioritized corridors, based on their existing zoning

Dixie Highway, Atlantic Blvd. and Federal Highway (projects underway, and influenced by using their Complete Streets manual) Renamed districts to relate to/embrace what the area actually offers, and how economic activity should be considered Example, how will closing a street impact economic development? Undergoing in-house training for staff and changing the culture R.O.W. is being accommodated to include Complete Streets solutions and designs Every project they're working on has to (now) integrate complete streets; new self-imposed challenge Next challenge is South Dixie (execution of work on private property and specifically parking challenges and cuts; due to wide driveways and people's layouts and comfort levels) City's form-based code (has been re-written recently) adopts solutions, and has been working so far successfully to guide design and planning City is measuring economic shifts and they are already seeing results; with continuing efforts to track changes ongoing City is incorporating elements that they didn't even consider before (i.e. smaller cars, sustainable vehicles, charging stations, how to incorporate technology) Peter Gies: MPO is interested in this area and how the approach should be varied; MPO supports and applauds City of Pompano Beach's efforts with Complete Streets Arlene Davis: Approach is critical to getting citizens to buy in, especially since City of Pompano Beach is reviewing every new road project against Complete Streets guidelines (to show community how they will be benefitted) IV.
