

BUNDLE L Bundle Areas exhibit a high demand for biking and walking and a high concentration of vulnerable populations.




DESCRIPTION

Bundle L is within the City of Miramar. The future land use is primarily residential with commercial recreation and commerce areas. The daily transit boarding and alighting for Broward County Transit (BCT) are less than 125. The 2017 Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) ranges from 12,900 to 47,500. Four proposed projects were identified in Bundle L along with the Pembroke Pines/Hollywood Trail.











Demand for Active Transportation




