The Broward MPO, in conjunction with multiple agency partners, is conducting the University Drive Mobility Improvements Planning Study, one of a series of transportation planning studies in Broward County aiming to define the future of the transportation network. The Project Advisory Committee (PAC) consisting of representatives from the thirteen municipalities along the corridor, Broward County, and various transportation agencies was created to serve as the community's voice throughout the study by helping to identify solutions and provide overall guidance.

University Drive is one of the County's most critical north-south transportation routes and faces many challenges, including heavy traffic congestion, limited convenient transit options, and a lack of safe and continuous sidewalks and bicycle facilities. This study explores a number of transportation improvement options for all users of the road to manage traffic congestion, increase travel options, and improve quality of life through a safer, more convenient, and comfortable transportation system.



# Message From The Chair

When contemplating the achievements of the Broward MPO since its creation in July 1977, Bob Dylan's song: "The Times They Are A Changing" seems quite apropos. Just as he wrote of reacting to unfolding situations, the MPO has adjusted over the years to changes occurring at the county, state and federal levels. In August 2010, the

MPO separated from its host agency, Broward County Board of County Commissioners, and became an independent agency in order to better react to evolving local needs, grant opportunities and federal and state requirements. Over time we have received increased funding from the Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration as well as various grant resources; and, as noted in the last edition of this newsletter, the MPO has recently begun to collect a Membership Fee to engage lobbyists to be a persistent face in front of various committees that approve projects and allocate funds.

Between the initial creation of the MPO and 2010, the County's population increased by over 800,000. More people equates to more traffic on the roadways; thus, the MPO

has continued to focus upon improving transportation facilities of all types in an effort to reduce automobile trips and promote walkable communities. As noted in the article below, our draft Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) proposes a wide variety of projects, including those that enhance bike and pedestrian safety and increase the use of transit facilities. For example, a high priority is the development of a Universal Fare card. The MPO is establishing a pilot program in coordination with the various Miami-Dade Transit agencies, FDOT and Broward County Transit which would allow a rider to use one card to pay for the fare for the various transit facilities. Another very important project the MPO is partnering in is the Tri-Rail Coastal Link, an 85-mile commuter rail service on the FEC railroad from downtown Miami to Jupiter. This commuter service is estimated to have 20 to 25 stations linking 28 municipalities.

I encourage you to continue to participate in the transportation planning process through our **Speak Up Broward** initiative and to view and understand your long range transportation plan: **Commitment 2040**. ## TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

The MPO has just released a draft of the **2014/15 – 2018/19 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)**. The TIP is a list of federal, state and locally funded transportation projects, including transit, roadways, bridges, aviation, seaport, rail and commuter rail, bicycle facilities, pedestrian provisions, and enhancement projects like landscaping and greenways.

### TIGER GRANT FUNDING

The topic was an application for federal grant funding through the Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) program to assist with railroad safety infrastructure costs to potentially qualify as Quiet Zones, reducing the number of required train horns along the FEC corridor after an anticipated increase in rail traffic.
