Community Meeting Feedback Summary

Miramar Parkway, from SW 172nd Avenue to Dykes Road

Pembroke Road, from SW 145th Avenue to Flamingo Road

Tuesday, October 10, 2023

Overview

The purpose of this memo is to present the feedback garnered from the community meeting to discuss preliminary concept designs for study corridors on sections of Miramar Parkway and Pembroke Road. For each corridor, two (2) conceptual design alternatives were prepared, and presented at the Miramar Police Headquarters Community Room on October 10, 2023, at 5:30pm. The meeting was well attended, with plenty of valuable comments received from engaged and passionate Broward County residents. The community meeting was also attended by an elected official from both cities, including the Vice Mayor of the City of Pembroke Pines, Iris Siple, and Miramar City Commissioner and MPO Board Member Yvette Colbourne.

Preferred Alternatives

Following the initial presentation of the concept designs for each alternative option on both corridors, the meeting moved into an open discussion where attendees applied green or red dots along the study corridor printouts to signify proposed concepts they liked (green) or didn't like (red). With that in mind, the pros and cons of each option were discussed in greater depth in smaller, individual conversations that focused more on specific questions or details within the concepts themselves. An additional goal of this discussion segment of the community meeting was to ask participants which alternative was their preference on each corridor, and subsequently gauge the consensus of the community in attendance.

Among the most pertinent feedback received was an emphasis from attendants on the importance of ADA improvement measures on both corridors, but particularly on Pembroke Road, due to its intersection with an entrance to Century Village at SW 129th Avenue. Additionally at this intersection, and also at Flamingo Road, one participant urged our staff to implement an audible pedestrian crossing signal.

The primary stance of the feedback received from meeting attendees leaned towards a preference for greater bike lane protection and separation from roadway. This holds true on both study corridors, with the preferred alternatives on each indicating preference for this: On Miramar Parkway, **Alternative 1** (Figure 1) was preferred (with an overwhelming amount of support for the controlled intersection recommendation at the Miramar Park entrance), while on Pembroke Road, **Alternative 2** (Figure 4) was preferred. For each, respondents vouched for the greater comfort and safety that a bike lane removed from adjacency with a traffic lane would provide, regardless of the prospect of incurring greater

monetary costs for a more thorough reconstruction. Several people additionally commented that if the bike lane were to be removed from the curb/shoulder next to a travel lane and placed in a raised separated location closer to the sidewalk, they would be far more likely to ride their bikes on these roadways.

Next Steps

Building from the feedback from this community meeting, the next steps are to refine planning-level cost estimates, as well as prepare plans with specific renderings of the preferred recommendations. Additionally, a subsequent community meeting will follow to present the preferred alternatives on both Miramar Parkway and Pembroke Road.






Project Alternates

 - Alternate 2: Reconstruction of curb and gutter, design/construct custom inlet cap above stormwater inlet


