Technology Industry Forum

Learn how Industry partners are advancing innovation and technology. The Forum will highlight practical applications of AI, digital twins, automation, and systems integration of data sets that elevate planning, safety, operations, and system performance. With the Broward MPO's SMART METRO digital twin prototype now complete, the next stage aims to scale the Platform. The Forum invites industry partners, technology innovators, and transportation experts to help shape its future direction. Key features of the next stage include a 3D virtual environment, automated workflows, real-time scenario testing, and integrated analysis across transportation, housing, economic development, and stormwater systems. A major focus is the development of an AI-enabled prioritization process that clearly demonstrates how projects are evaluated and advanced through transparent, measurable criteria.

The Forum includes a Transportation Innovation & Technology Showcase with the following participants.

AECOM

AECOM will highlight its Sustainable Ways to Integrate Future Transportation (SWIFT) model developed for the Texas Department of Transportation, that uses a performance-based framework designed to harmonize transportation, land use, and economic development. AECOM will explore how emerging technologies like automated vehicles and MaaS impact regional sustainability and provide insights into SMART METRO's at-scale implementation strategy that leverages active user engagement, organizational change programs, and cross-sector collaboration to transform complex data into actionable strategic plans.

Bentley Systems, Inc.

Bentley Systems will explore the future of transportation infrastructure. This session showcases how an open, AI-powered digital twin platform can accelerate project delivery and optimize asset performance. Discover how to connect data across the entire infrastructure lifecycle—from planning to operations. We will demonstrate how our integrated software stack empowers infrastructure professionals to break down data silos, make smarter, data-driven decisions, and build more resilient transportation networks for tomorrow's communities.

Decision Lens

Planners can assess impacts, defer lower priority work, and produce clear comparative reporting for decision makers. The result is a continuous loop from system signal to structured response within the TIP and STIP environment.

High Street Consulting Group will demonstrate how MPOs move from goals and data to decisions that stakeholders trust. High Street will share national lessons from supporting agencies across the U.S. with performance-based planning, prioritization frameworks, and decision-support tools, focusing on transparency, practicality, and long-term ownership. High Street will also demonstrate the use of agentic AI to bridge gaps in local data.

WSP will demonstrate how its Land iQ tool is designed to streamline processes by unifying complex methodologies into a single, accessible platform. Land iQ implements WSP's Future ReadyTM approach with a deep understanding of the land-use framework and leverages diverse data assets and common assumptions to foster consistent, evidence-based decision-making. By rationalizing existing digital resources and eliminating duplication, Land iQ allows agencies to accurately assess impacts and explore new opportunities within a scalable environment. Ultimately, it serves as a centralized hub for strategic intelligence, ensuring that planning remains data-driven, cost-effective, and adaptable to future requirements.
