



A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN SOUTHWEST RANCHES, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING THE ADDITION OF THE GRIFFIN ROAD WIDENING / BICYCLE LANES AND LIGHTING FROM BONAVENTURE BOULEVARD TO US 27 PROJECT INTO THE FINAL 2045 METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN; COMMITTING TO WORKING THE **BROWARD** WITH METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (MPO), TRANSPORTATION PARTNERS, AND THE PUBLIC, TO PREPARE THE PROJECT FOR PROGRAMMING IN THE BROWARD MPO'S TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, TOWN ADMINISTRATOR, AND TOWN ATTORNEY TO **EXECUTE ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS DEEMED NECESSARY AND** PROPER TO HELP EFFECTUATE THE INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS,** the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) approved the draft *Commitment 2045* Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) Cost Feasible Plan on May 9, 2019; and

**WHEREAS,** Griffin Road Widening / Bicycle Lanes and Lighting Project has been identified as a transportation need and is currently a ranked project in the approved draft 2045 MTP Cost Feasible Plan; and

**WHEREAS,** this project consists of widening Griffin Road from two (2) lanes to four (4) lanes from US 27 to Bonaventure Boulevard, constructing new bicycle lanes and sidewalk, and installing solar lighting to illuminate the intersections; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to Resolution 2018-035, the Town Council requested the MPO to add this project to the Plan; and

**WHEREAS,** a Resolution from the Town of Southwest Ranches Town Council stating support for the project is required for the project to be included in the final 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Southwest Ranches commits to working with the Broward MPO, transportation partners, and the public, to prepare the project(s) for programming in the Broward MPO's Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, this project has been determined to the in the public's best interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHWEST RANCHES, FLORIDA:

# Roadway Priority 53 - Southwest Ranches

**Section 1.** The above-referenced recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.

**Section 2.** The Town Council hereby supports the inclusion of the Griffin Road Widening / Bicycle Lanes and Lighting Project into the final 2045 MTP.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Town Council commits to working with the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), transportation partners, and the public,c to prepare the project for programming in the Broward MPO's Transportation Improvement Program.

<u>Section 4.</u> The Town Council hereby authorizes the Mayor, Town Administrator, and Town Attorney to execute any and all documents necessary and proper to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.
