On May 19, 2020, Item 10, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2020-274 authorizing the Director of the Transportation Department (BCT) to submit a Grant Application to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for Federal Grant Program funds pursuant to 49 U.S.C. Section 5339(B), for Bus and Bus Facilities Competitive Federal Grant Program funds in the amount of \$17,275,000, to rehabilitate and reconstruct the Transit Division's Copans Road Operations and Maintenance Facility, and authorized the County Administrator to take any necessary administrative and budgetary actions to implement the grant. The FTA grant included a County match of \$30,825,724, in Transportation Surtax funds. In addition, the project included the construction of a locally funded parking garage structure for a combined total project budget of \$76,240,000 in 2023 dollars. This original project included rehabilitating existing structures, constructing new operations and training facilities, a parking structure, and the power infrastructure for electric buses and support vehicles.

Based on recent preliminary engineering assessments including escalating construction costs, BCT's engineering and architectural consultants, determined that the original rehabilitation plan was not cost effective; nor would it accommodate future growth of the transit system and fleet electrification. Accordingly, the project scope was revised, which resulted in a new total project budget of \$225,680,000. This created a projected funding gap of \$149,440,000, which is proposed to be met by allocating \$139,440,000 in Transportation Surtax dollars and \$10,000,000 in FTA Formula Grant Funds.

The Transportation Oversight Board previously confirmed the project and the use of surtax funds as statutorily eligible. This item would authorize transfer of the additional \$139,440,000 in surtax funds upon determination by the Transportation Oversight Board of continued statutory eligibility of the proposed additional expenditures. Thereafter, BCT will request official approval from the FTA to modify the grant to include demolishing the existing bus garage and constructing a new combined operations and maintenance facility with new rooftop bus parking. This agenda item is being submitted in advance of the Transportation Surtax Oversight Board's upcoming April 12, 2023, special meeting to consider the modified project and the use of surtax funds as statutorily eligible due to the FTA's suggestion that the request for approval be submitted as soon as possible.

#### Project Descriptions

- A total of \$125.9 million is budgeted in FY24-26 for Transportation Department offices and an intermodal center as part of the Government Center Replacement project.
- There is a total of \$199.1 million budgeted for fixed route buses, paratransit vehicles and planning studies in the Transit category of projects in FY23-27.
- Transit has budgeted a total of \$1.1 billion for design and construction of transitway projects including vehicle purchases. An estimated match of non-local funding revenue totaling \$716.5 million is budgeted in FY25-27 to support these projects.
- Transit infrastructure projects including information technology and security enhancements; bus stop and shelter improvements; park and ride lots; a third maintenance facility project; reconstruction of the Copans facility; a Paratransit operational facility; electric bus charging infrastructure; facilities and

infrastructure improvements; park and ride lots; the West Broward Intermodal center; West Regional transfer facility; and the Hollywood Transit Transfer facility are budgeted for a total of \$472.7 million in FY23-27.

- Public Works highway projects including adaptive signal control, fiber optic, mast arms, intersection improvements, school zones, road capacity expansion, bike lanes including resurfacing, lighting improvements, sidewalks including road drainage, video detection, bridges, and drainage projects are budgeted for a total of \$337.9 million in FY23-27. In FY24 there is \$7 million budgeted as non-local match revenue for the Pine Island Nova Drive to Griffin Road capacity expansion project.
- An annual \$60 million is budgeted for Regional Transportation expenses and projects in FY23-27.

Dear County Administrator Cepero:

Please accept this formal transmittal in my new role as Chair of the Transportation Surtax Oversight Board's ("Oversight Board") as required by Section  $31\frac{1}{2}$  -75(i)(1), of the Broward County Code of Ordinances. I look forward to working with you in this capacity and commend the many committed and capable staff you have working on this program.

Proposed projects and proposed expenditures were approved as to eligibility under Section 212.055(1), Florida Statutes by the Oversight Board during the Regular Agenda of April 27, 2023. Specifically, we approved as statutorily eligible:

- 1. The proposed project and proposed expenditures in the amount of \$17,500,000 for design and construction of roadway drainage improvements in the Boulevard Gardens Municipal Service District; \$8,750,000 of which is eligible for reimbursement under a Resilient Florida Grant award received from the State. (Item #4 for Public Works Department).
- 2. Proposed additional expenditures in the amount of \$5,000,000 for design and construction of improvements to Sheridan Street Bridge over the Turnpike, which is a project that was previously determined to be statutorily eligible. (Item #5 for Public Works Department).
- Additional expenditures in the amount of \$139,440,000 for Copans Road Operations and Maintenance Facility Renovation Project (Copans), which is a project that was previously determined to be statutorily eligible. On April 18, 2023 (Item No. 24), the Board of County Commissioners approved funding subject to the Oversight Board's action. (Item #6 for Transportation Department).

Pursuant to Broward County Code of Ordinances, Article V, Section 31½ -75(j) "All projects and expenditures funded with Transportation Surtax proceeds shall be subject to the Oversight Board's review, critique, and assessment for the duration of the projects or expenditures. The Oversight Board shall issue reports on the performance of ongoing projects and shall provide recommendations to the Broward County Administrator and the County Commission for any proposed performance improvements." Copans has been an active surtax-funded project since FY 2020 when the Oversight Board first determined that the proposed project and proposed expenditures to be statutorily eligible. Transportation surtax proceeds are being used to fund the local required match to a federal grant in the amount of \$17.25M. We proudly reported on this project as the first example of accessing federal funding based on surtax participation, in furtherance of leveraging a projection of \$2.5B of non-surtax revenues over 30 years.

When the project was first presented to the Oversight Board (FY 2020), the federal grant award of \$17,250,000 accounted for almost a third of the project's expected \$51,376,208 cost estimate. The next year (FY 2021), the cost estimate rose to \$61,000,000. During the FY 2022 budget process, the cost estimate rose by another \$14,858,792; for a new total of \$76,240,000 owing to additional design elements and general escalation in construction costs.

When the project was presented to the Oversight Board April 27, 2023, the surtax funding accounted for approximately 93% (federal funds are now approximately 7%) of the total cost estimate of \$225,680,000, equating to more than a 400% increase in the project's total cost estimate over four years. However, the scope was also dramatically changed to create what is being described as a more resilient, better product: accommodating more buses, improving circulation, including necessary electric charging infrastructure, and addressing the functional obsolescence of facilities previously slated for rehabilitation.

The Oversight Board has historically expressed its strong support for public transit projects and embraced the PREMO plan presented at the April 27, 2023 Oversight Board meeting with enthusiasm. And while we approved the statutory eligibility of the additional \$139,440,000 for Copans, as stewards of the public tax dollars generated for this program, we were concerned about doing so. The Transportation Department indicated that the Copans facility would meet fleet capacity needs until at least 2030 and that increased capacity at the Copans facility will allow additional time for the Transportation Department to secure property, design, and construct the 3<sup>rd</sup> Maintenance Facility by 2030 to meet fleet capacity needs from 2030 and beyond. Nonetheless, the Oversight Board recommends deferral of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Maintenance Facility (\$97M) included in the original surtax financial plan and reallocation of those funds to partially offset the significant increase in costs for Copans.

We also offer a general recommendation that any time an active project has a material change in scope or significant increase in cost (beyond average inflation in that project type) that the requesting entity provide a detailed fiscal analysis (i.e., value of deferred projects, reallocations, increasing revenues, cost savings in other areas, etc.). Doing so provides the Oversight Board and public with a level of transparency and reassurance that other future projects promised to the voters will not be sacrificed as a result of substantial cost increases in current projects.
