As part of the Complete Streets Initiative, the Broward MPO is hosting a webinar to bring city officials proven strategies implemented in other communities that may help guide decisions in response to COVID-19 pandemic challenges.

Physical distancing recommendations are adapting policies on public spaces to reflect the new normal. In response, local departments of transportation and transit agencies are testing new ideas, experimenting with pilot projects, and simply responding to a rapidly evolving environment.

From strategies such as pop-up bike lanes, sidewalk-widening, open streets, bikeshare access, curbside pick-up zones for businesses, automated pedestrian signals, and more.
